To whom it may concern,

Enoch Duplechan has been a great asset to our company in housing homeless Veterans and has been a big proponent in ending the homeless issue we have with our Veterans in Sacramento. He is also one of the few landlords in Sacramento willing to work with low income and credit challenged individuals.

The Sacramento Veterans Resource Center has many programs where the end goal is to get all of our Veterans permanently and stably housed. With that being said, below is a brief description of our programs in Sacramento.

- **Supportive Services for Veterans Families (SSVF):** The Supportive Services for Veterans Families (SSVF) program assist clients with security deposits, rent, utility arrears and other cost that come with establishing or maintaining an effective and healthy household. Low income and formerly homeless veterans are offered case management, housing search assistance, budgeting and money management trainings, benefits assistance, property owner mediation and life skills to help stabilize their housing situation. The SSVF program is a Rapid Rehousing and Homelessness Prevention program, provided by the VA. We currently have approximately 100 clients in need of housing.
- **Men's Transitional Housing:** A 30 bed, residential program, where veterans focus on barriers such as: benefits, employment, housing, education, life skills, and community reintegration. This program is Veterans Administration funded. There is a one to two year waiting list for this program and the end goal is to get all of the Veterans in this program stably housed.
- **Women's Transitional Housing:** also a 2-year residential program, with 5 beds for veteran women and up to 3 beds for their children. This program also addresses individual barriers including employment, housing, education, childcare, life skills and community reintegration. The Veterans Administration funds this program. There is up to a two year waiting list for this program and the end goal is to get all of the Veterans in this program stably housed.
- **Behavioral Health Center:** Our Behavioral health Center (BHC) is a 22-bed residential facility that works with veteran individuals who are dual diagnosis, meaning that they have both a mental health diagnosis and a drug or alcohol issue. It is a 90-day program and can be extended at the client's request. Housing, coping skills, life skills, benefits, employment, sober living and community reintegration are highly focused on in the BHC program, funded by the Veterans Administration. There is a one to two year waiting list for this program and the end goal is to get all of the Veterans in this program stably housed.

We are happy to have Enoch Duplechan to partner with to end the homeless epidemic for Veterans in Sacramento.
